

## **“Two Minute Miracles” Setting Up Digital Slideshows**

*Instead of flipping through scrapbooks to view Aunt Marge’s trip to Sedona, embrace digital slideshows to share vacation photos.*

*In this “Two Minute Miracles” video, Agent Cardozo will show you how fast and easy it is to display photos using digital slideshows.*

The following is a simple checklist of what’s needed to display digital photos:

- 1) A computer, either a laptop or desktop, with a USB port
- 2) A digital camera that is able to connect through USB to a computer
  - As numerous photos will consume a lot of disk space, an external hard drive is recommended as a media backup
- 3) A digital frame for showcasing photos away from the computer is another great option

### **Displaying Photos**

- 1) To transfer photos from the digital camera to your computer, simply plug the camera into the computer using the USB cable.
  - When using Windows Vista, a prompt will appear when the camera is plugged into the computer. Select “Import pictures using Windows” and all of your photos will be automatically transferred to your personal “Pictures” folder
  - Once the photos are transferred to the computer, Geek Squad recommends that they are backed up to an external hard drive or CD/DVD for safekeeping or easy portability
- 2) When using Windows Vista, open the Windows Photo Gallery by clicking on the Start button, select “All Programs” and then “Windows Photo Gallery.” All of your photos will be displayed there, ready for use.
  - From the Windows Photo Gallery, photos can be burned to a CD for backup, burned to a DVD in a slideshow format to be displayed on a TV or simply emailed to friends or family
  - Selecting the “Play Slideshow” button (in the center of the Windows Photo Gallery toolbar located near the bottom of the windows) will display and cycle the photos full screen on your computer

- 3) A digital photo frame allows you to access and display photos from the computer through a wireless network. Watch a digital slideshow from last night's holiday feast while eating leftovers for breakfast.
